



PITT STATE HISTORY

The Pittsburg State University basketball program is living out the newest chapter to its storied history annals.

It took the arrival of head coach Gene Iba to revive a Gorilla program that had grown increasingly stagnant during the previous quarter century, after flourishing during the four-decade reign of legendary head coach John Lance (1923-63) that saw the program earn nine postseason berths.

Since Iba's arrival to the PSU campus in the summer of 1995, his Gorillas blossomed nearly overnight into one of the most successful basketball programs in the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association and the South Central Region of NCAA Division II.

PSU has made five trips to the NCAA Division II National Tournament in the last 13 years. During that 13-year span, the Gorillas have averaged 18 wins per season, placing the team among the top programs in the MIAA and the South Central Region during that time.

Ten years ago, Iba's group captured its first conference title since 1975.

Not bad for a program that had enjoyed just four winning seasons between 1975 and 1995, when Iba was hired as Pittsburg State University's 13th head coach.

Iba's initial season was a far cry from the school's glory days in the late 1920s and early 1930s when the Gorillas won 47 consecutive games.

It also was a far cry from PSU's 1942 and 1956 teams that captured third-place national finishes at the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City.

On July 5, 1995, when Iba arrived on the PSU campus, just three total players remained from a meandering sub-.500 program. In spite of the odds, Iba led the Gorillas to a highly-respectable 14-14 record in his first season, a third-place showing in the MIAA and three upset wins over top 10 foes.

With the foundation in place, the Iba-led Gorillas shocked everyone but themselves the next year when they posted a 24-8 record and reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Division II National Tournament, making the school's first-ever trip to the NCAA postseason. PSU posted its first NCAA postseason wins by beating MIAA rival Missouri Western (72-70) and the region's top seed, (No. 4 nationally) Central Oklahoma (90-84), to reach the South Central Region Finals, before falling a game short of reaching the Elite Eight in an 89-83 loss to Texas A&M-Commerce.

Iba's Gorillas were equal to the task again during the '97-98 campaign – making their second straight trip to the NCAA-II National Tournament and posting their second straight 24-win season with a 24-6 overall record.

PSU posted an 85-70 win against MIAA rival Northwest Missouri in the first round of the postseason, but the Gorillas' run ended prematurely in the semifinals when regional host West Texas A&M pulled out a 90-79 victory.

In '98-99, Iba and the Gorillas outdid themselves yet again. After opening the season unranked, PSU won 22 of its first 23 games to rise to the No. 1 ranking in the country on Feb. 15. The Gorillas won 18 consecutive games at one point before finishing the regular season with a 23-3 record and a share of the MIAA title – PSU's first conference title in a quarter century.

The Gorillas made their third straight trip to the NCAA-II National Tournament, earning a bye into the regional semifinals. There, PSU didn't have enough answers to hold off a determined Abilene Christian squad and the Gorillas' season ended with 24 wins against five losses.

The Gorillas narrowly failed to qualify for the NCAA-II National Tournament from 2000-04, but Pitt State returned to the national field during a 23-7 campaign in 2005. The Gorillas scored a first-round tournament win against St. Mary's University, before falling to eventual NCAA-II national semifinalist Tarleton State, 65-59 in overtime, in the NCAA-II Round of 32. In 2006-07, the Gorillas returned to the national tournament, falling in the first round to MIAA rival Northwest Missouri.

PITT STATE HISTORY



While PSU's recent fortunes have been sparked by Coach Iba, legendary head coach John Lance truly put Pittsburg State on the basketball map during his 40-year tenure from 1923-63.

Pittsburg State began intercollegiate basketball competition modestly in 1909 by winning all four games it played while under the direction of Albert McLeland.

The next five years (1910-14) John Fuhrer directed the Gorillas to a 21-20 overall record. R.O. Courtright led PSU for the next four seasons, before Garfield Weede took over the program in 1920. Weede enjoyed moderate success (31-32 overall) during his three-year tenure, but when John Lance took over as head coach in 1923, PSU became consistently successful for the next 40 years, and the Gorillas were virtually unbeatable at times.

The Gorillas won an incredible 47 straight games during one stretch from 1929 to 1931. PSU went 20-0 in 1929-30 and 21-0 the next year. The Gorillas won their first six games of the '31-32 season before losing to Northwest Missouri.

PSU played in postseason tournaments seven times, placing third

at the NAIA National Tournament in 1942 (23-5) and 1956 (27-2) and compiling a 16-7 overall postseason mark under Lance.

Lance's PSU record was 582-322 (.644). He served as head coach for 45 percent of the Gorillas' all-time wins (1301) in the history of the program. His 656 overall wins as a college head coach (he also coached at Southwestern Oklahoma) place him in the top 20 on the all-time coaching victory list.

PSU's tradition of excellence continued after the Lance Era. The Gorillas made their eighth post-season appearance in 1966 under head coach Paul Lambert, and PSU returned to the NAIA Tournament in 1972 under head coach Bob Johnson.

Since 1975, PSU has posted 15 winning seasons: in 1976-77 under Johnson, in '84-85 under Jerry Reynolds, in '85-86 under Ken Ash, in '91-92 under Dennis Hill and 11 of the last 13 seasons under Coach Iba.

Still, Pittsburg State enters the 2009-10 season 11th among NCAA Division II programs in all-time victories.

ATHLETES

The recipient shall have earned a degree, or the equivalent thereof, for the period of time the athlete attended PSU. In a team sport, the recipient shall have earned NAIA or NCAA All-American status, not including honorable mention. Multiple first-team All-Conference selection and significant placement in PSU school records can serve as a substitute for All-America criteria. In an individual sport, the recipient must have finished in the top three in NAIA or NCAA National Championship competition. An athlete is eligible for induction following a 10-year period from the completion of his/her athletic eligibility.

John Lance
Head Coach
1923-63

With 656 career wins John Lance was one of the all-time winningest collegiate basketball coaches... he posted a 582-323 record at PSU and his teams won or shared 14 league titles during his 40-year tenure... from 1929-31 his Gorillas won 47 consecutive games... inaugural member, Class of 1988.



Clinton Brown
1948-51

Clinton Brown finished a decorated career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,134 points... he earned All-CIC honors each of his final three seasons, including first-team All-CIC accolades in '50-'51... basketball legacy member, Class of 2006.



Francis Hoffman
1925-28

Francis "Arkie" Hoffman was one of PSU's most popular basketball players of his era... he earned All-State and All-America honors as a senior in 1928... a four-year letterwinner, Hoffman also was a team captain... Class of 1989.



Bruce Palmer
1953-56

Bruce Palmer was an NAIA All-American as a senior in '56 and a two-time All-CIC performer... Palmer established the school career scoring record at the time, finishing his four-year career with 1,217 points... he still holds the school record for career free throws (569)... inaugural member, Class of 1988.



Clarence Ratzlaff
1930-33

Clarence "Pansy" Ratzlaff was a three-time All-Conference player... he helped lead the Gorillas to their record 47 consecutive wins between 1929 and 1932... Class of 1991.



Jim Chroust
1963-66

Jim Chroust was a two-time NAIA All-American and a three-time All-CIC performer... he set the school single game scoring record with 48 points in a win against the College of Emporia in '66... he scored 1,587 points and grabbed 688 rebounds in his PSU career... inaugural member, Class of 1988.



Ernest Schmidt
1930-33

Ernest Schmidt is the only PSU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame... he finished his career scoring exactly 1,000 points, earning him the nickname "One Grand"... an AAU All-America in 1932, he was recognized as the greatest player in the Missouri Valley at the time... inaugural member, Class of 1988.



Calvin Kinzer
1972-75

Calvin Kinzer was a three-time NAIA All-American during his four-year career at PSU... he established the PSU career scoring record, finishing with 1,833 points in 102 career games... Kinzer, who also was a three-time All-GPAC performer, had 768 career rebounds... inaugural member, Class of 1988.



LeRoy "Uhlie" Uhlenhop
1938-41

LeRoy Uhlenhop earned All-CIC honors in each of his final three seasons... earned first-team All-CIC and was named captain of the 1941 CIC All-Star squad as well as the team's defensive MVP... also named MVP of the 1941 Oklahoma City Christmas Tournament... Class of 2007.



Marc Eddington
1996-97

Marc Eddington became the first PSU player to earn NCAA Division II All-America honors during his senior season in 1997... he finished his decorated two-year career with 1,090 points... a two-time first-team All-MIAA performer... helped lead the Gorillas to their first NCAA Tournament berth and a run to the Sweet 16 in 2007... Class of 2009.
