OPENING TIP

Pitt state continues its stint of games against the conferences top teams this week with tonight's game against No. 6 Washburn, who is second in the league standings, and Saturday's game against Fort Hays State, who is currently third in the conference, just ahead of the Gorillas. The conference race is tight among the first four teams. Emporia State leads the MIAA with a 7-1 conference record and a 14-1 overall record. Washburn is second at 7-1 and 13-1. Fort Hays just edges out the Gorillas for third with a 6-2 record, while the Gorillas are fourth at 5-2.

SCOUTING WASHBURN

Washburn (13-1, 7-1 MIAA) had a 13-game win streak snapped with a 65-70 loss to Missouri Southern on Saturday (Jan. 9) in Topeka. Prior to the loss, the Lady Blues had won their games by an averages of 21.7 points. They had only two wins by fewer than 10 points and seven by less than 20.

The Lady Blues average 75.7 points and 39.4 rebounds per game. The team averages 17.4 assists per game, while committing only 15.5 turnovers. The team hits 45 percent from the floor, including .393 from three-point range. The team shoots only 66 percent from the free throw line. Washburn holds opponents to 55.9 points per game and a .367 shooting percentage.

Dayna Rodriguez leads the Lady Blues with 13.3 points per game. She is the second leading rebounder with 6.1 boards per game. She has 12 blocks on the season. Amanda Fessenden also averages double figures with 10.7 points per game. Rose Hammond and Hope Gregory are just under double figures at 9.6 and 9.4 points per game, respectively. Gregory is the team's rebounding leader with 6.8 rebounds per game. Hammond leads the team in assists (3.57 apg) and steals (2.28 spg). She also has the team's best shooting percentage (.543, 57-for-105). Fessenden is the team's top three-point shooter have hit 39-of-90shots from beyond the arc this season for a .433 percentage.

SCOUTING FORT HAYS STATE

Fort Hays State is 13-2 overall and 6-2 in conference action. The team's only losses have been to Washburn at Hays and Nebraska-Omaha in Omaha. The team is currently on a four game win streak, most recently defeating Missouri Southern, 73-68, in Hays on Monday (Jan. 11) night.

The Tigers average 72.1 points per game, while holding opponents to 57.6. The team grabs 36.1 rebounds per game and are out-rebounded by their opponents by 2.1 rpg. They are shooting .431 from the field, including .360 from three point range. The Lady Hornets hit 75 percent from the charity stripe.

Naomi Bancroft is the MIAA's leading scorer with 19.7 points per game. She has made 58 threes thus far this season, that is only 19 fewer than the Gorillas have made as a team. She hit eight threes against Missouri Southern on Monday night. Bancroft leads the Tigers in steals and shares the lead in assists. Erica Biel is the team's leading rebounder with 6.5 boards per game. She leads the team in blocks with 25. She also averages double figure scoring with 10.4 points per game.

SCOUTING PITT STATE

The Gorillas are 7-7 on the season and 5-2 in MIAA play. The Gorillas only conference losses were at Truman and No. 7 Emporia State. Each of the seven Gorilla losses have come on the road. The team picked up its first road win at Southwest Baptist and added another against Northwest Missouri. Pitt State opened the season with a win over then No. 12 Central Oklahoma and also opened the conference portion of the season with a win over Missouri Western.

Pitt State is shooting .398 from the floor and averaging 68.8 points and 40.8 rebounds per game. The team is hitting only .268 from three-point range and .689 from the charity stripe. One troubling spot for the Gorillas is the assist/turnover ratio. The Gorillas have only one assist for every 1.91 turnovers and average 21.1 turnovers a game.

DePrice Taylor leads the Gorillas with 14.1 points per game and is the second leading rebounder, grabbing 5.9 rebounds per game. She leads the team in rebounds in conference games (7.0 rpg). She also leads the team in assists. Nicole McCombs averages 12.8 points per game overall, but ups that average to 14.2 ppg in league play. She is the Gorillas' leading rebounder with 6.8 rpg. Early season sharp-shooter Drew Roberts has hit a cold spell of late, but Bailey Waugh's shot has been heating up. Roberts has hit 23 threes, while Waugh has 22, though Waugh's percentage is slightly better at .349

to .307 for Roberts. Due to her double scoring efforts in most of the early season games, Roberts still averages just under double figures at 8.7 points per game. After some really great games, Laura Glenn has become more of a target in the opponent scouting reports, so she has not been scoring as much, but still averages 8.1 points per game. Larissa Richards has not been much of a scoring threat yet, but she is averaging 4.6 points and 3.7 rebounds per game in only 13 minutes of play per game. She is also tops at disrupting opponent shots with 22 blocks on the season.

As a team, the Gorillas give up 69.7 points per game, but out-rebound opponents by four.

PSU VS. WASHBURN

Pitt State broke a 16-game losing streak to the Lady Blues with a 94-87 win on Jan. 21, 2009. Prior to that Pitt State had not won a game against Washburn since a 69-57 win on Feb. 10, 2001 in Topeka. The two teams met three times last season. The teams split the regular season series, but the Lady Blues got the best of the Gorillas in the MIAA Tournament.

The Gorillas trail The Lady Blues 25-44 in the all-time series. Washburn leads 20-14 in Pittsburg, 22-11 in Topeka and 2-0 at neutral sites.

The longest streak of wins in the series is Washburn's 16-game streak from Feb. 23, 2002 to Jan. 14, 2009. Pitt State longest win streak was eight games from Jan. 8, 1997 to Jan. 15, 2000.

The biggest margin of victory in the series was 65 points in a Washburn 101-36 win in the very first meeting on Jan. 18, 1975. Pitt State's biggest win was 20 points on Jan. 28, 1978 in a 72-52 victory in Topeka.

PSU VS. FORT HAYS STATE

Fort Hays leads the all-time series with Pitt State 22-15. The two teams split games last season, with each team winning on the road. The Tigers lead 10-8 in Pittsburg and 12-7 at Hays.

The longest streak of wins in the series was seven by the Tigers in the first seven meetings between the two teams from Jan. 11, 1975 to Jan. 26, 1979. Pitt State's longest string of wins has been only four from Feb. 16, 1979 to Jan. 30, 1981.

The most points scored by either team in a game was 101 by Pitt State in a 101-94 win in Pittsburg on Feb. 1, 1986. The largest margin of victory in the series was 56 points by FHSU in the first meeting. PSU's largest margin of victory has been 22 points on Jan. 30, 1981.

LAST TIME OUT

Cassandra Boston scored a game-high 23 points to spark seventh-ranked Emporia State University to a 79-62 win over Pittsburg State University Saturday (Jan. 9) at W.L. White Auditorium.

The Hornets overcame a rugged shooting performance early, outscoring Pitt State 25-4 over the final 7:09 of the first half to secure a 38-30 halftime lead.

The Gorillas (7-7, 5-2 MIAA) jumped out to a 12-3 lead against the Hornets (14-1, 7-1 MIAA), scoring 12 straight points after an early 3-0 deficit. Pitt State expanded its lead to as many as 13 points, at 26-13, on Nicole McCombs' three-point play.

ESU, which missed 12 shots in a row at one point in the first half and started the game 3-for-17 from the floor, chipped its way back into the contest, however. Back-to-back 3-pointers by Cassandra Boston and Sophia Lenard gave the Hornets a 29-28 edge with 2:52 remaining in the half.

Pitt State reclaimed the lead at 30-29 on a pair of free throws by DePrice Taylor 18 seconds later, but ESU closed out the half with a 9-0 run.

Boston scored a game-high 12 points in the half for the Hornets, which shot 37.5 percent from the field (12 of 32). ESU converted nine of its final 15 shots from the floor in the opening period.

ESU continued its torrid pace in the second half, expanding its lead to double figures on Pitt State. The Gorillas, after initially closing to six points on the first possession of the second half, got no closer than eight points of the Hornets in the game's final nine minutes.

Boston finished the game 7-for-15 from the field, adding a game-high eight assists for the Hornets. Lenard chipped in with 12 points for ESU, which finished the game shooting 42.6 percent from the field.

Maya Onikute scored a team-leading 15 points for the Gorillas, while McCombs added 14 points and seven rebounds before fouling out with 7:22 to play in the game. DePrice Taylor also chipped in with 10 points for Pitt State, which shot just 33.3 percent from the field in the game and committed 21 turnovers.

MCCOMBS NAMED MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Pittsburg State senior forward Nicole McCombs was named the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Jan. 4.

McCombs averaged 17.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game in Pitt State's three post-Christmas games against Central Missouri, Northwest Missouri and Missouri Southern. The senior from Richmond, Va., has been a crucial part of Pitt State's 5-1 conference start.

In only 19 minutes against Central Missouri, McCombs scored 19 points, 11 in the second half and nine in the last 2:33 of the game. Against Northwest, she recorded a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, both season highs. McCombs finished the week with 12 points and four rebounds in the win over Missouri Southern.

For the season, McCombs is Pitt State's second-leading scorer, averaging 12.6 points per game. She is the team's leading rebounder, averaging 6.6 boards per game. McCombs is shooting .603 from the field and .750 from the free throw line.

McCombs is the daughter of Michael and Fronnie McCombs. She is majoring in psychology.

She also ranks seventh in rebounding (6.7 rpg), third in offensive rebounds (3.1 orpg) and fourth in free throw percentage (.761, 51-for-67). Maya Onikute is 13th in rebounding (5.6 rpg), 10th in offensive rebounds (2.2 orpg) and seventh in steals (1.7 spg). Larissa Richards is third in blocks (1.6 bpg) and 10th in offensive rebounds (2.2 orpg). Bailey Waugh is ninth for three-point percentage (.349)

PRESEASON POLL

The Pittsburg State University women's basketball team drew the No. 3 pick by both conference coaches and media representatives in the 2009-10 MIAA Preseason Polls, released Tuesday (Oct. 27) at the Downtown Marriott.

The Gorillas received three first-place votes and 86 total points in balloting of the MIAA's 11 coaches. Pitt State earned one first place vote and 236 points in voting among 28 regional media representatives.

Emporia State University earned the preseason No. 1 ranking in both polls, while Washburn University was tabbed second in each poll.

Pitt State posted a breakthrough 20-9 record during the 2008-09 season, advancing to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament under second-year head coach Lane Lord. The Gorillas notched their first 20-win season in a decade and narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA-II National Tournament.

"I think expectations are very high in our third year," said Lord. "With the players we have returning, like Nicole McCombs and DePrice Taylor, I think people are recognizing that we have good quality depth. It is flattering to get three first-place votes from the coaches and have our colleagues recognize that we can compete and the top of the league."

McCombs returns for her senior season after earning first-team All-MIAA honors as a junior last year. She averaged a team-leading 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game last season.

"It is nice to see that Pitt State is gaining respect among the coaches and media in the MIAA," McCombs said. "We appreciate the recognition, but hope to exceed expectations."

PSU IN EXHIBITION GAMES

The Gorillas played three exhibition games against teams from the Big 12 Conference. The Gorillas went 0-3 in those games, but got good experience against tough competition.

Pitt State fell to Kansas, 86-56. Nicole McCombs led the Gorillas with 11 points, while Maya Onikute and Larissa Richards shared the rebounding lead with six a piece.

Against Nebraska, the Gorillas lost 68-54, but played much better basketball. PSU trailed the Huskers by only three points with 11 minutes left in the game. Drew Roberts led the team with 17 points, while Laura Glenn led with seven rebounds.

The Gorillas led Kansas State for most of the first half, before poor shooting and turnovers helped them to a 89-61 loss to the Wildcats. McCombs again led the team in scoring,
