OPENING TIP

This week the Gorillas close out the first half of the conference schedule and open the second half. Pitt State closes the first 10 games of the conference slate with a match up against the Lady Mavs in Omaha, Neb. on Wednesday night. The second half of the season opens with Missouri Western in St. Joseph on Saturday.

SCOUTING NEBRASKA-OMAHA

Like the Gorillas, Nebraska-Omaha has a 9-7 record, but the Lady Mavs are only 4-5 in MIAA action. They are currently in seventh in the conference standings. In its last outing, UNO fell 57-60 in a tight game with Missouri Southern in Joplin, Mo.

Nebraska-Omaha averages 63.6 points and 39.4 rebounds per game. They allow opponents only 58.7 points per game. The Lady Mavs are shooting .367 from the floor overall, but only .226 from three-point range. They allow opponents a .360 overall shooting percentage and a .287 percentage from three point range.

Alyssa Green is the only UNO player averaging double figures this season with 14.6 points per game. She is also the team's leading rebounder with 5.2 boards per game. Heather Pohl has also been strong on the boards with 5.1 rebounds per game. She averages just under double figure scoring at 9.3 points per game. Ashley Nelson averages 8.9 points and 5.0 rebounds per game and leads the team in blocks with 30. Jamie Nash leads the team with 47 assists and 51 steals on the year.

SCOUTING MISSOURI WESTERN

Missouri Western is 5-11 overall and 3-6 in conference action. The team's three conference wins were over Truman, Northwest Missouri and Missouri Southern. The team is coming off a 61-83 loss to Central Missouri on Saturday and will play a Tuesday game against Southwest Baptist before meeting up with the Gorillas.

The Griffons average 59.1 points per game, while allowing opponents 65.8. The team grabs 35.6 rebounds per game and are out-rebounded by their opponents by 4.3 rpg. They are shooting .379 from the field, including .319 from three point range. The Griffons hit 71 percent from the charity stripe.

Two Missouri Western players average double figures. Jessica Koch is the team's leading scorer and rebounder with 14.8 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. As the go-to player for the Griffons Koch also leads the team in assists and steals. Lauren Nolke averages 10.3 points per game. She leads the team in blocks with Rachel Luteyn.

SCOUTING PITT STATE

The Gorillas are 9-7 on the season and 7-2 in MIAA play. They currently sit in second place in the conference race. The Gorillas only conference losses were at Truman and No. 7 Emporia State. Each of the seven Gorilla losses have come on the road. The team picked up its first road win at Southwest Baptist and added another against Northwest Missouri. Pitt State opened the season with a win over then No. 12 Central Oklahoma and also opened the conference portion of the season with a win over Missouri Western.

Pitt State is shooting .393 from the floor and averaging 68.2 points and 41.6 rebounds per game. The team is hitting only .274 from three-point range and .680 from the charity stripe. One troubling spot for the Gorillas is the assist/turnover ratio. The Gorillas have only one assist for every 1.74 turnovers and average 20.3 turnovers a game. This aspect of Pitt State's game has been looking up as of late however. The team has had less than 20 turnovers in three of the last four games and only averaged 14.5 turnovers in each of the last two games.

DePrice Taylor leads the Gorillas with 13.8 points per game and is the second leading rebounder, grabbing 5.9 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in assists and steals. Nicole McCombs averages 12.2 points per game overall. She is the Gorillas' leading rebounder with 6.7 rpg. Bailey Waugh and Drew Roberts battle for Pitt State's three-point shooting lead. Roberts has hit 25 threes, while Waugh has 24, though Waugh's percentage is slightly better at .329 to .294 for Roberts. Laura Glenn and Maya Onikute each grab over five rebounds a game for the Gorillas, Glenn with 5.4 and Onikute with 5.7. Onikute scores just under double figures at 9.4 points per game. Larissa Richards has not been much of a scoring threat yet, but she is averaging 4.5 points and 3.9 rebounds per game in only 14 minutes of

play per game. her time on the court is steadily increasing, resulting in more scoring and rebounding opportunities. She is tops at disrupting opponent shots with 28 blocks on the season.

As a team, the Gorillas give up 68.6 points per game, but out-rebound opponents by four.

PSU VS. NEBRASKA-OMAHA

Pittsburg State and UNO have met four times, three of those times being last season. Pitt State holds a 3-1 lead in the series and is 1-0 at home, 1-1 in Omaha and 1-0 at neutral sites.

The Lady Mavs won the first meeting between the two teams on Dec. 4, 1998, 76-67, in Omaha. Pitt State has won each of the last three meetings.

The most points scored in series happened last season in the MIAA Tournament, a 81-79 win for the Gorillas. Pitt State has the biggest win in the series, a 13-point victory, 69-56, on Jan. 21, 2009.

PSU VS. MISSOURI WESTERN

Pitt State and Missouri Western have met almost regularly twice a year since the 1976-77 season. Missouri Western leads the overall series 46-18, including a 18-13 record in Pittsburg, a 25-5 mark in St. Joseph and a 3-0 record at neutral sites.

The longest run of wins between the two teams was a seven-win streak by the Griffons from March 3, 2005 to Jan. 23, 2008. Pitt State broke the streak by winning a 73-65 decision on Feb. 13, 2008. Pitt State is in the midst of their longest streak in the series, as it has won each of the last four meetings between the two teams.

The largest margin of victory in the series was a 29-point win (94-65) by the Griffons on Feb. 23, 1985 in St. Joseph. Pitt State's biggest win was a 95-71 win in Pittsburg on Jan. 19, 2005.

The most points scored by a team in the series was 101 by the Gorillas in a 101-82 win on Jan. 24, 1996 in Pittsburg.

LAST TIME AGAINST MISSOURI WESTERN

The Pittsburg State Women's Basketball team (3-4, 1-0 MIAA) overcame a seven-point half time deficit to earn a 60-43 win over Missouri Western (1-4, 0-1 MIAA) to open MIAA play on Wednesday (Dec. 2) at John Lance Arena.

The Gorillas outscored the Griffons 37-13 in the second half to earn the win. Missouri Western shot only 23 percent from the field in the second half, while Pitt State forced 10 turnovers to help contribute to the lopsided scoring. The Gorillas also went to the free throw line 15 times in the second period, compared to only four times for the Griffons.

Junior Laura Glenn led all players with a career-high 15 points. She also added two assists and two steals. Senior Nicole McCombs added 13 points, while freshman Drew Roberts had 11. Senior

DePrice Taylor and sophomore Larissa Richards led the team with seven rebounds a piece. Taylor also had a career-high five steals.

Kayla Vice was the only Missouri Western player in double figures with 11.

The Gorillas shot .414 from the floor, including .385 from three-point range, in the second half compared to just .286 from the floor and .154 from beyond the arc in the first half. Pitt State outrebounded the Griffons 42 to 34, including 17 offensive rebounds contributing 16 second chance points.

Missouri Western controlled most of the first half, building a nine-point leads at 28-19 with 3:45 remaining and 30-21 with 57 seconds to go. Richards hit a layup with 30 seconds left to send Pitt State to the lockerroom down 30-23.

The two teams battled back and forth in the eraly part of the second half. Pitt State started the half on a 8-1 run to tie the game at 31-31. Taylor hit a free throw with 17:01 to go to give Pitt State its first lead of the half. The Griffons would grab the lead just one more time at 40-9 with 12:53 to go. Roberts hit a three with 10:21 remaining to give the Gorillas the lead for good. A 16-0 run gave Pitt State the 55-40 lead. That run included four threes by three different PSU players. Missouri Western wouldn't get any closer than 12 and Pitt State went on a 5-0 run to end the game.

UP NEXT

The Gorillas return home on January 27 to face Truman, one of the only two teams who have beat them in conference play this season. Tip off is set for 5:30 p.m. Pitt State finishes off the month with a 1:30 p.m. matchup with Central Missouri in Warrensburg on Saturday.

LAST TIME OUT

The Pittsburg State Women's Basketball team earned a 71-65 victory over Fort Hays State on Saturday afternoon in John Lance Arena. With the win, the Gorillas take sole possession of third-place in the in the conference race as the first half of the season nears its close.

However, pending the results of the Emporia State vs. Washburn game in Topeka, Kan., the Gorillas could move up as high as sole possession of second. A win by Emporia State would make the Lady Blues 7-3, pushign the Gorillas into sole possession of second. A Washburn win would drop Emporia State to 7-2 and the Gorillas would be tied with the Lady Hornets for second.

This afternoon's win was key in pushing the Gorillas forward in the MIAA race. For the fourth time in the last five games, Pitt State gutted out a win in the games waning minutes. After trailing by seven, 48-41, with 13:31 to go in the game, Pitt State went on a 25-11 run lasting eight minutes to take a seven-point lead of its own, 66-59, with 5:52 to go.

Fort Hays scored six consecutive points to cut Pitt State's lead to one, 66-65 with 4:24 left, but the Gorillas responded and played good defense to hold the Tigers scoreless for the remainder of the game.

Though the game was tied 28-28 at the half, it was almost a tale of two halves for both teams. Fort Hays out rebounded the Gorillas by six, 23-17 in the first half, including 10 offensive rebounds resulting in nine second chance points. The Gorillas had only four offensive rebounds and four second chance points in the first half. In the second half, Pitt State outrebounded the Tigers 26-18 to finish 43-41 for the game. The Gorillas pulled down 10 offense rebounds in the second half, resulting in eight second chance points compared to only two second chance points for Hays. The Gorillas also scored easier in the second half, putting up 43 points compared to only 28 in the first half. Both teams had almost double their first half points by the 10 minute mark in the second half.

Nicole McCombs paced the Gorillas with 14 points and 14 rebounds. She also dished out two assists and had two steals. Maya Onikute continued her hot shooting with 13 points on a 4-for-6 performance, including two threes. She also dished out a game high seven assists and pulled down six rebounds. Though they were they only two Gorilla players in double figures, other stepped up in the win as well. DePrice Taylor was tough defensively, as she held the Tigers' Naomi Bancroft, a player who leads the league scoring nearly 20 points a game, to just 13 points. Taylor added eight points to Pitt State's scoring efforts. Amanda Orloske came off the bench to hit some crucial threes, finishing the game 3-for-4 from deep and adding nine points, three assists and two steals. Marissa Poppe also contributed seven points and some aggressive defense.

Pittsburg State senior forward Nicole McCombs was named the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Jan. 4.

McCombs averaged 17.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game in Pitt State's three post-Christmas games against Central Missouri, Northwest Missouri and Missouri Southern. The senior from Richmond, Va., has been a crucial part of Pitt State's 5-1 conference start.

In only 19 minutes against Central Missouri, McCombs scored 19 points, 11 in the second half and nine in the last 2:33 of the game. Against Northwest, she recorded a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, both season highs. McCombs finished the week with 12 points and four rebounds in the win over Missouri Southern.

For the season, McCombs is Pitt State's second-leading scorer, averaging 12.6 points per game. She is the team's leading rebounder, averaging 6.6 boards per game. McCombs is shooting .603 from the field and .750 from the free throw line.

McCombs is the daughter of Michael and Fronnie McCombs. She is majoring in psychology.

PRESEASON POLL

The Pittsburg State University women's basketball team drew the No. 3 pick by both conference coaches and media representatives in the 2009-10 MIAA Preseason Polls, released Tuesday (Oct. 27) at the Downtown Marriott.

The Gorillas received three first-place votes and 86 total points in balloting of the MIAA's 11 coaches. Pitt State earned one first place vote and 236 points in voting among 28 regional media representatives.

Emporia State University earned the preseason No. 1 ranking in both polls, while Washburn University was tabbed second in each poll.

Pitt State posted a breakthrough 20-9 record during the 2008-09 season, advancing to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament under second-year head coach Lane Lord. The Gorillas notched their first 20-win season in a decade and narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA-II National Tournament.

"I think expectations are very high in our third year," said Lord. "With the players we have returning, like Nicole McCombs and DePrice Taylor, I think people are recognizing that we have good quality depth. It is flattering to get three first-place votes from the coaches and have our colleagues recognize that we can compete and the top of the league."

McCombs returns for her senior season after earning first-team All-MIAA honors as a junior last year. She averaged a team-leading 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game last season.

"It is nice to see that Pitt State is gaining respect among the coaches and media in the MIAA," McCombs said. "We appreciate the recognition, but hope to exceed expectations."

PSU IN EXHIBITION GAMES

The Gorillas played three exhibition games against teams from the Big 12 Conference. The Gorillas went 0-3 in those games, but got good experience against tough competition.

Pitt State fell to Kansas, 86-56. Nicole McCombs led the Gorillas with 11 points, while Maya Onikute and Larissa Richards shared the rebounding lead with six a piece.

Against Nebraska, the Gorillas lost 68-54, but played much better basketball. PSU trailed the Huskers by only three points with 11 minutes left in the game. Drew Roberts led the team with 17 points, while Laura Glenn led with seven rebounds.

The Gorillas led Kansas State for most of the first half, before poor shooting and turnovers helped them to a 89-61 loss to the Wildcats. McCombs again led the team in scoring, this time with 12 points. Onikute was the leading rebounder with nine.

Over the three exhibition games, Roberts led the team with 12.3 ppg and hit eight threes. while shooting .412 from the floor. McCombs was the only other player averaging double figures with 11.7 ppg. Maya Onikute led the team with 5.7 rpg and 2.7 apg.

GORILLAS SIGN THREE

Pittsburg State University Women's Basketball Coach Lane Lord announced the signing of three student-athletes in the early signing period on Thursday (Nov. 19.). Sara Molz, Katy Cooper and Y'cedria Devers will play for the Gorillas beginning in the 2010-11 season.

Cooper is a 6-2 forward from Stella, Mo. She is a student at East Newton High School. She earned All-Big Eight Conference honors last season as she helped East Newton to

a 17-11 record in 2009. Last season she averaged 14 points and 12 rebounds per game. She has been a four-year starter in both basketball and volleyball for the Patriots. Cooper is undecided on a major. She is the daughter of Sara Camerer and Steve Cooper.

"Katy is very athletic," Lord said. "She runs the floor well and blocks shots. She is very good in transition on both offense and defense. She will add a lot of athleticism in the post position."

Y'cedria Devers is a 5-9 guard/forward from Bixby, Oklahoma. She attends Bixby High School. In 2009 she was a Tulsa World honorable mention all-area selection. As a junior she averaged eight points, just over six rebounds and four steals per game. She is the daughter of Y'vette Cornelius and Cedric Devers and plans to major in early childhood education at PSU.

"Y'cedria is a combo guard who likes to get to the basket," Lord said. "She is a tremendous athlete who will work well with our style of play."

Sara Molz is a 5-4 point guard from Kiowa, Kan. She attends South Barber High School. Last season she averaged 13 points, 4.3 rebounds and 5.3 assists for the Cheiftans. She helped her team to a third place finish in the state in 2008 and a sub-state runner-up finish in 2009. She has been named all-state three times. In addition to being a four-year starter in basketball, Molz has also been a four-year starter in volleyball and a two-year letterwinner in track. She is the daughter of Ron and Kristi Molz and plans to major in elementary education at Pittsburg State.

"Sara is also a combo guard who can shoot the three," Lord said. "She is a floor leader and sees the floor very well."

"We fulfilled some needs in this recruiting class," Lord said. "We have signed a guard, forward and center that will replace some of the positions that we will lose after this season. All three are very
