OPENING TIP

Pitt State has lost two in a row, but return home for a midweek game against Truman to try to turn their luck before heading to Warrensburg for a Saturday matchup against Central Missouri. The Gorillas are undefeated at home this season, but have a 2-9 record on the road and at neutral sites.

SCOUTING TRUMAN

Truman is 7-11 on the season overall and 2-9 in MIAA play. On Saturday, the Bulldogs ended a seven game losing streak with a 64-57 win over Missouri Southern in Kirksville.

Truman averages 60.8 points per game, while allowing opponents 64.2 ppg. The team hits .405 from the floor, including .358 from three-point range. They grab 34.9 rebounds per game.

Laura Joya is the top scorer for Truman as she averages 12.6 points per game. Breanna Daniels also averages double figures with 12.1 points per game. Daniels is the team's top three-point shooter, having hit 23 threes on the season. Joya is just behind her with 19 threes on the year.

Sarah Seberger is the team's leading rebounder with 4.6 rpg. Daniels is just behind her with 4.2 rpg. Amy Galey and Becka McHenry control the backcourt and distribute 56 percent of the team's assists.

SCOUTING CENTRAL MISSOURI

Central Missouri is 10-8 overall and 6-5 in conference action. The Jennies have won three consecutive games. Their last loss was Jan. 13 to Northwest Missouri.

Central averages 69.7 points per game, while holding opponents to 68.5. The team grabs 36.3 rebounds per game. They are shooting .438 from the field, including .352 from three-point range. The Jennies hit 67 percent from the charity stripe.

Deidra Dace leads the Jennies averaging with 11.7 points per game. Rebecca Roberts adds 11.4 ppg. Danielle Shows also averages double figures (10.1 ppg) and Meghan Waggoner averages double figures (10.4 ppg) in conference games only. Brittney Slifer is the team's top three-point shooter hitting 28-of-77 for the season. Taylor Hanson has hit 25-of-68 threes for the year. Shows leads the MIAA with 7.5 rebounds per game. She also leads UCM in assists (3.7 apg) and steals (1.6 spg).

SCOUTING PITT STATE

The Gorillas are 9-9 on the season and 7-4 in MIAA play. They currently sit in third place in the conference race. Each of the nine Gorilla losses have come on the road.

Pitt State is shooting .387 from the floor and averaging 67.7 points and 41.5 rebounds per game. The team is hitting only .273 from three-point range and .668 from the charity stripe. One troubling spot for the Gorillas is the assist/turnover ratio. The Gorillas have only one assist for every 1.8 turnovers and average 20.6 turnovers a game.

DePrice Taylor leads the Gorillas with 13.4 points per game and is the second leading rebounder, grabbing 5.8 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in assists and steals. Nicole McCombs averages 13.1 points per game overall. She is the Gorillas' leading rebounder with 6.6 rpg. Bailey Waugh and Drew Roberts battle for Pitt State's three-point shooting lead. Waugh has 27 threes to 25 for Roberts. Waugh is also shooting a slightly better percentage, .329 from three-point range. Laura Glenn and Maya Onikute each grab over five rebounds a game for the Gorillas, Glenn with 5.4 and Onikute with 5.7. Amanda Orloske got her first start of her career against Missouri Western, played 35 minutes and scored in double figures for the first time in her career. The Gorillas will look for her to be more of a factor in the second half of the conference season.

As a team, the Gorillas give up 68.8 points per game, but out-rebound opponents by 3.1.

PSU VS. TRUMAN

Pitt State leads the all-time series with Truman 23-10. The two teams have met regularly each season since 1990. The two teams started with home-and-home meetings each season in 1999. Pitt State leads 13-3 in Pittsburg and 10-7 in Kirksville. The two teams have never met at a neutral site.

Pitt State has had two long streaks of wins in the series. The Gorillas opened the series with eight straight wins from Jan. 14, 1990 to Feb. 10, 1996. The other long run for the Gorillas was seven wins

from Jan. 18, 2003 to Jan. 14, 2006. The Bulldogs have only won back-to-back games twice in the series. The first time was on Feb. 15 and 23, 1999, with one win in each location. The second time was last season as the Bulldogs took the game in Kirksville, 76-64, and in Pittsburg, 79-72.

The biggest win in the series was a 62-point victory (97-35) by the Gorillas in Pittsburg on Feb. 22, 1993. Truman's biggest win was by 15 points in a 78-63 decision in Kirksville on Feb. 26, 2000.

The most points scored in the series was a 104-102 Pitt State win on Jan. 28, 1995 in Kirksville.

PSU VS. CENTRAL MISSOURI

Central Missouri leads the series between the two teams, 24-16. Each team leads on its home court, with Pitt State holding an 13-6 advantage in Pittsburg and UCM leading 17-3 in Warrensburg. The Jennies won the one neutral site meeting.

The teams split the series last season with each team winning on their home court. The Jennies took the early meeting, 66-56, in Warrensburg, while Pitt State won a 81-79 overtime decision at John Lance Arena. Pitt State won the earlier matchup in Pittsburg this season. A recap of that game is on page 5.

The largest margin of victory by either team was a 25-point UCM win (78-53) on Jan. 3, 2000 in Pittsburg. The largest PSU win was 17 points, three different times, Jan. 12, 1998 (70-53), Jan. 13, 1999 (71-54) and Jan. 23, 1999 (65-48).

Pitt State has never won more than two games in a row over the Jennies. Central Missouri had a streak of five consecutive wins two times, from Jan. 3, 2000 to Feb. 28, 2001 and Dec. 30, 2004 to Dec. 9, 2006.

LAST TIME AGAINST TRUMAN

Overtime proved to be dangerous for the Pittsburg State women's basketball (3-5, 1-1 MIAA) team on Saturday (Dec. 5) afternoon, as the Gorillas fell 75-63 to Truman in Kirksville, Mo. Truman outscored PSU 12-0 in the overtime for the win.

The Bulldogs Breanna Daniels led all scorers with 23 points. Laura Joya added 22 to help the Bulldogs who shot 49 percent for the game, including 50 percent from beyond the arc.

Pitt State did not fare so well from long range, as they hit only 2-of-20 from three-point range. Senior Maya Onikute led Pitt State with 13 points. Junior Laura Glenn followed with 12 points, including a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line. DePrice Taylor scored 11 and Larissa Richards added 10 for the first double figure scoring game of the season. Glenn, Onikute and Taylor led the Gorillas with five rebounds a piece.

Truman held a narrow lead most of the first half, but the Gorillas went on a 6-0 run over two minutes to take a 16-15 lead with 6:10 to go. Jones drove the lane for a layup with just over two minutes to go, giving Pitt State a two-point lead, but the Bulldogs would score the last eight points of the half to

earn a 26-20 lead at the half.

Pitt State whittled at Truman and tied the game three times before taking a two-point lead with just over 10 minutes to go on two Glenn free throws. The Bulldogs tied the game again, but an Amanda Orloske three, one of only two in the game for PSU, gave Pitt State the 41-38 lead. The Gorilla lead stretched to five on a Taylor layup, the largest Pitt State lead of the game. Truman took the lead back, but Pitt State stayed in the game the whole way, leading to eight ties in the last eight minutes of the game, including the game tying bank shot three by Roberts with 18 seconds left.

LAST TIME AGAINST CENTRAL MISSOURI

The Pittsburg State women's Basketball team (5-6, 3-1 MIAA) kept its home record spotless, while moving to 3-1 in MIAA play with a 67-62 win over Central Missouri (6-5, 2-2 MIAA) on Monday (Dec. 28) night at John Lance Arena.

Pitt State, who is 4-0 at home this season, was led by senior Nicole McCombs with 19 points. Senior DePrice Taylor recorded her second double-double of the season with 11 points and a team-high 11 rebounds. She also led the team with six assists on the night. Freshman Drew Roberts also added 11 points for the Gorillas. Sophomore Larissa Richards swatted a team-high four blocks.

The Gorillas, who have struggled from the free throw line at times this season, shot a season-high 91 percent from the charity stripe on the night, including a perfect 15-for-15 second half. Though both teams were dry from behind the arc, Pitt State's 31 percent three-point shooting bested 12 percent by the Jennies. The teams were even on the glass, each recording 38 rebounds.

Pitt State opened the game with a 12-0 run over the first five minutes. The team kept a double digit lead for most of the second half, until a 9-0 Central Missouri run brought the visiting team within three with 3:27 to go. Pitt State did not allow the Jennies to score again in the second half. Taylor hit two free throws and Marissa Poppe drained a three to give the Gorillas a 27-19 lead at the half.

The two teams battled early in the second half, but a 7-0 Central Missouri run lasting just under two minutes gave the Jennies their only lead of the game at 34-33. Pitt State worked its lead back up to as many as six, but UCM hung close. With Pitt State up 52-49, The Jennies' Taylor Hansen nailed a three to tie the game at 52-all. From there Pitt State's free throw shooting allowed the Gorillas to keep the Jennies at arm's length, resulting in the 67-62 win.

UP NEXT

The Gorillas return home on January 27 to face Truman, one of the only two teams who have beat them in conference play this season. Tip off is set for 5:30 p.m. Pitt State finishes off the month with a 1:30 p.m. matchup with Central Missouri in Warrensburg on Saturday.

LAST TIME OUT

Missouri Western (7-11, 5-6 MIAA) held the Pitt State women's basketball team (9-9, 7-4 MIAA) without a shot from the floor, and only four points from the free throw line, in the last four minutes of the game to earn a 74-67 win over the Gorillas on Saturday (Jan. 23).

Nicole McCombs led PSU with a season-high 22 points and six rebounds. Amanda Orloske added a career-high 16 points, her first double figure scoring game of the season. DePrice Taylor added 12 points, five rebounds and a team high three assists and four steals.

Missouri Western's Kayla Vice led all scorers with 26 points. Lauren Nolke scored 16. Jessica Koch contributed a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds.

Despite a slow start offensively, the Gorillas were able to earn a 36-32 lead at the half. 13 of PSU's first half points were from the line. Pitt State trailed through the first 10 minutes of the game. The team took its first lead 16-15 on a Taylor free throw with 8:29 to go. From that point, the Gorillas went on a 16-4 run and to gain a 26-19 lead over a four minute span.

The Griffons then went on a little run of their own, holding Pitt State scoreless for over three minutes to take a one-point lead, 29-28. The two teams battled through the final two minutes of the half, but the Gorillas scored the last four points of the half to secure the half time lead.

Pitt State opened the second half with a 12-4 run to take an 11-point lead. The Gorillas couldn't stay comfortable in the lead however, as Missouri Western's Vice scored 15 of her 17 second half points in a five minute span to take a 55-54 lead with just under 10 minutes to go. A Bailey Waugh three with

McCombs averaged 17.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game in Pitt State's three post-Christmas games against Central Missouri, Northwest Missouri and Missouri Southern. The senior from Richmond, Va., has been a crucial part of Pitt State's 5-1 conference start.

conference coaches and media representatives in the 2009-10 MIAA Preseason Polls, released Tuesday (Oct. 27) at the Downtown Marriott.

The Gorillas received three first-place votes and 86 total points in balloting of the MIAA's 11 coaches. Pitt State earned one first place vote and 236 points in voting among 28 regional media representatives.

Emporia State University earned the preseason No. 1 ranking in both polls, while Washburn University was tabbed second in each poll.

Pitt State posted a breakthrough 20-9 record during the 2008-09 season, advancing to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament under second-year head coach Lane Lord. The Gorillas notched their first 20-win season in a decade and narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA-II National Tournament.

"I think expectations are very high in our third year," said Lord. "With the players we have returning, like Nicole McCombs and DePrice Taylor, I think people are recognizing that we have good quality depth. It is flattering to get three first-place votes from the coaches and have our colleagues recognize that we can compete and the top of the league."

McCombs returns for her senior season after earning first-team All-MIAA honors as a junior last year. She averaged a team-leading 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game last season.

"It is nice to see that Pitt State is gaining respect among the coaches and media in the MIAA," McCombs said. "We appreciate the recognition, but hope to exceed expectations."

PSU IN EXHIBITION GAMES

The Gorillas played three exhibition games against teams from the Big 12 Conference. The Gorillas went 0-3 in

those games, but got good experience against tough competition.

Pitt State fell to Kansas, 86-56. Nicole McCombs led the Gorillas with 11 points, while Maya Onikute and Larissa Richards shared the rebounding lead with six a piece.

Against Nebraska, the Gorillas lost 68-54, but played much better basketball. PSU trailed the Huskers by only three points with 11 minutes left in the game. Drew Roberts led the team with 17 points, while Laura Glenn led with seven rebounds.

The Gorillas led Kansas State for most of the first half, before poor shooting and turnovers helped them to a 89-61 loss to the Wildcats. McCombs again led the team in scoring, this time with 12 points. Onikute was the leading rebounder with nine.

Over the three exhibition games, Roberts led the team with 12.3 ppg and hit eight threes. while shooting .412 from the floor. McCombs was the only other player averaging double figures with 11.7 ppg. Maya Onikute led the team with 5.7 rpg and 2.7 avg.

GORILLAS SIGN THREE

Pittsburg State University Women's Basketball Coach Lane Lord announced the signing of three student-athletes in the early signing period on Thursday (Nov. 19.). Sara Molz, Katy Cooper and Y'cedria Devers will play for the Gorillas beginning in the 2010-11 season.

Cooper is a 6-2 forward from Stella, Mo. She is a student at East Newton High School. She earned All-Big Eight Conference honors last season as she helped East Newton to a 17-11 record in 2009. Last season she averaged 14 points and 12 rebounds per game. She has been a four-year starter in both basketball and volleyball for the Patriots. Cooper is undecided on a major. She is the daughter of Sara Camerer

and Steve Cooper.

"Katy is very athletic," Lord said. "She runs the floor well and blocks shots. She is very good in transition on both offense and defense. She will add a lot of athleticism in the post position."

Y'cedria Devers is a 5-9 guard/forward from Bixby, Oklahoma. She attends Bixby High School. In 2009 she was a Tulsa World honorable mention all-area selection. As a junior she averaged eight points, just over six rebounds and four steals per game. She is the daughter of Y'vette Cornelius and Cedric Devers and plans to major in early childhood education at PSU.

"Y'cedria is a combo guard who likes to get to the basket," Lord said. "She is a tremendous athlete who will work well with our style of play."

Sara Molz is a 5-4 point guard from Kiowa, Kan. She attends South Barber High School. Last season she averaged 13 points, 4.3 rebounds and 5.3 assists for the Cheiftans. She helped her team to a third place finish in the state in 2008 and a sub-state runner-up finish in 2009. She has been named all-state three times. In addition to being a four-year starter in basketball, Molz has also been a four-year starter in volleyball and a two-year letterwinner in track. She is the daughter of Ron and Kristi Molz and plans to major in elementary education at Pittsburg State.

"Sara is also a combo guard who can shoot the three," Lord said. "She is a floor leader and sees the floor very well."

"We fulfilled some needs in this recruiting class," Lord said. "We have signed a guard, forward and center that will replace some of the positions that we will lose after this season. All three are very athletic and talented."
