OPENING TIP

This is the week of the Gorillas vs. Bearcats as Pitt State hosts both Southwest Baptist and Northwest Missouri in John Lance Arena on Wednesday night and Saturday afternoon.

The Gorillas are excited to be returning home after playing three of their last four games on the road. Pitt State's road woes have continued. In fact, the only two games the team has won on the road this season were over the two teams it is facing this week.

Pitt State will most likely be playing without its top two scorers on Wednesday. DePrice Taylor is questionable for Wednesday's game, after rolling her ankle mid-second half at Central Missouri on Saturday. Nicole McCombs will sit out Wednesday's game after being ejected for a flagrant foul near the eight minute mark in the second half at Central Missouri. Despite those set back, Pitt State has a deep bench and has seen promising play from recent starters Amanda Orloske and Marissa Poppe. Courtney Tate is another smart player who has come off the bench and played tough defense and made smart offensive decisions to help the team. Larissa Richards will have a chance to increase her scoring and rebounding averages on top of adding more blocks to her season totals.

SCOUTING SOUTHWEST BAPTIST

Southwest Baptist is 4-15 on the season and 2-10 in MIAA play. Most recently the Bearcats won a 55-50 decision over Missouri Southern in Bolivar. Prior to that, the team had lost seven games in a row. The team's other conference win was over Truman, 77-73, in Kirksville on Dec. 30.

The team averages 64.6 points and 29.5 rebounds per game. They are shooting .398 from the floor, including .328 from beyond the arc.

The Bearcats have two players averaging double figures. Rachel Graves leads the team with 12.4 points per game. Courtney Heady scores 10.7 ppg. Graves and Heady are the team's leading three point shooters with 48 and 46, respectively. Jasmine Sanford is the team's leading rebounder with 4.9 boards per game. Ashleigh Gallio leads the team in assists with 3.7 a game.

SCOUTING NORTHWEST MISSOURI

Northwest Missouri is 11-9 overall and 7-6 in conference action. The team has won four of its last six games, including a 75-54 win over Fort Hays State in Maryville on Saturday..

The Bearcats average 69.8 points per game, while allowing opponents to 69.5. The team grabs 37.7 rebounds per game. They are shooting .390 from the field, including .351 from three-point range. Northwest hits at a 75 percent from the charity stripe.

Gentry Dietz leads the Bearcats averaging 16.0 points per game. Abby Henry adds 14.9 ppg while Gabby Curtis is also in double figures with 12.6 ppg. Shelly Martin is the team's top three-point shooter hitting 31-of-71 for the season. Curtis has hit 28-of-99 threes for the year. Dietz is the leading rebounder with 8.0 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in blocks.

SCOUTING PITT STATE

The Gorillas are 10-10 on the season and 8-5 in MIAA play. They are currently tied for third in the MIAA race with Fort Hays State. Each of the 10 Gorilla losses have come on the road.

Pitt State is shooting .392 from the floor and averaging 68.2 points and 41.0 rebounds per game. The team is hitting only .283 from three-point range and .668 from the charity stripe. One troubling spot for the Gorillas is the assist/turnover ratio. The Gorillas have only one assist for every 1.7 turnovers and average 19.9 turnovers a game. The team did better in that respect last week, as they only committed an average of 13 turnovers in the two games against Truman and Central Missouri and had a season low nine turnovers against the Bulldogs.

DePrice Taylor leads the Gorillas with 13.5 points per game and is the third leading rebounder, grabbing 5.5 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in assists and steals. Nicole McCombs averages 12.7 points per game overall and 13.3 ppg in conference action. She is the Gorillas' leading rebounder with 6.6 rpg. Bailey Waugh and Drew Roberts battle for Pitt State's three-point shooting lead. Roberts has 29 threes to 27 for Waugh. Waugh shooting a slightly better percentage, .318, from three-point range. Laura Glenn and Maya Onikute each grab over five rebounds a game for the Gorillas, Glenn with 5.1 and Onikute with 5.7. Amanda Orloske got her first start of her career against Missouri Western, played 35 minutes and scored in double figures for the first time in her career. She is averaging

only 4.1 points per game overall, but has scored an average of 10.2 ppg in each of the last five games. Marissa Poppe's scoring average has not risen much as a starter, but she has been a help to the team in other ways, particularly in distributing the ball and rebounding. She dishes out a career-high eight assists against Truman and averaged four rebounds per game last week.

As a team, the Gorillas give up 67.4 points per game, but out-rebound opponents by 1.2.

PSU VS. SOUTHWEST BAPTIST

Pitt State and SBU have met twice a year since the 1987-88 season. Pitt State has a one-game advantage in the series, 24-23, after winning each of the last three meetings. Each team leads in its home arena, the Gorillas lead 15-9 in Pittsburg, while the Bearcats lead 14-9 in Bolivar. The two teams have never met at a neutral site.

Prior to last season SBU had won four straight over the Gorillas, the longest streak of wins by either team in the series. The series began with each team winning only on its own court. SBU gave up the first Gorilla victory in Bolivar on Feb. 4, 1992. Pitt State won 10 straight at home before falling, 86-75 on Valentine's Day of 1996.

The largest margin of victory in the series was a 37-point Pitt State win on Jan. 6, 1981, the very first meeting between the two teams. SBU's biggest win was a 82-52 win in Bolivar on Dec. 1, 1987, only the third meeting between the teams. Since then things have been more evenly matched, for the most part. The most points scored in the series was a 101-95 Bearcat win on Jan. 8, 2005 in Bolivar.

Pitt State won the last meeting between the two teams, a 77-68 victory in Bolivar on Dec. 12.

PSU VS. NORTHWEST MISSOURI

Pitt State leads the series with Northwest Missouri 23-16. Each team leads on its home court, with Pitt State leading 13-4 in Pittsburg and the series tied 10-10 in Maryville. The teams are knotted at one game each on neutral courts.

Pitt State took both games against the Bearcats last season, winning a 73-70 decision in Pittsburg and a 72-57 game in Maryville.

The Gorillas have the longest streak of wins in the series, having won seven straight games from Jan. 10, 1993 to Feb. 17, 1996. The Bearcats longest streak of wins was four games from Nov. 19, 1988 to Jan. 11, 1992.

Sharp shooting in the first half and smart defense in the second half gave the Pitt State women's basketball team (4-5, 2-1 MIAA) a 77-68 win over Southwest Baptist (1-7, 0-2 MIAA) on Saturday (Dec. 12) evening in Bolivar, Mo.

Pitt State shot over 50 percent in the first half, including 53 percent from three-point range. The team committed only six fouls in the second half, only allowing the Bearcats to shoot only two free

throws. The Gorillas also rebounded well, out-rebounding the home team by 21, 44-23.

Senior DePrice Taylor led three players in double figures for the Gorillas with 18. Maya Onikute added 13, while Bailey Waugh had 12. Taylor was sharp on all fronts for the Gorillas as she was also the leading rebounder with nine and dished out seven assists on the night.

SBU's Rachel Graves led all players with 21 points. Courtney Heady added 12.

Pitt State found its stroke in the first half as they shot .552 from the floor, including .533 from three points range. Five different players contributed to the Gorillas eight threes in the half, including two a piece from Taylor, Waugh and Amanda Orloske. The Gorilla defense didn't allow the Bearcats to hit a shot from the field in the last 8:24 of the first half, though eight PSU fouls during that time frame did contribute to 10 points from the charity stripe. Pitt State took a 45-37 lead at the half.

The Bearcats bounced back in the early part of the second half, tying the game at 52-52 with 10:12 to go. Pitt State gained a two-point advantage on a Nicole McCombs shot in the paint, but a three-point shot by SBU's Chasity Prince gave the Bearcats the lead wit 7:52 to go. SBU added two more to take a 57-54 lead. From there, the Gorillas went on a 13-0 run to take a 10-point lead. Pitt State held the lead from then on, though the Bearcats were able to cut it to as little as seven. Taylor made six free throws in the last minute of the game to help contribute to the 77-68 win.

LAST TIME AGAINST NORTHWEST MISSOURI

The Pitt State women's basketball team improved to 4-1 in conference action and evened their record at 6-6 with a 79-68 win over Northwest Missouri in Maryville, Mo. on Wednesday (Dec. 30) evening.

Senior Nicole McCombs led the team with 20 points and 10 rebounds for a double-double. Junior Bailey Waugh added 17 points and was a perfect 5-for-5 from three-point range. Senior DePrice Taylor added 16 points, scoring 10 in the second half.

Four Bearcats scored in double figures, led by Abby Henry with 17. Gabby Curtis had 11 and Gentry Dietz and Shelly Martin each added 10.

The game was even to the first media timeout, 9-9, but then Pitt State began to pull ahead. Waugh hit three threes in under four minutes to help push the Gorillas to a 24-15 lead at the midway point in the half. The Gorilla defense held tough, holding the Bearcats scoreless from 6:33 to 2:45. During that span, the Gorillas poured in eight points to take a 36-20 lead. Northwest Missouri got a couple late buckets, but Pitt State answered and ended the first half with a 42-28 lead.

Pitt State did not hit its first shot from the floor in the second half until the 15:06 mark. The Bearcats outscored the Gorillas 10-5 during the first five minutes of the second half, with the only Gorilla points coming from the charity stripe. PSU's offense came alive just after the 14 minute mark as they went on a 10-2 run to take a double digit lead again at 59-44 with just under 12 minutes remaining. The Gorillas built as much as a 20-point lead, 66-46, with 8:55 remaining and was able to hold a double digit lead the rest of the game to finish with a 79-69 win.

UP NEXT

Pitt State plays only a midweek game next week, as they get a break from MIAA play on Saturday. Wednesday the team crosses the state line to face rival Missouri Southern in the deciding game of the women's basketball point for the Sonic Trophy Series.

LAST TIME OUT

Rebecca Roberts and Taylor Hanson combined for 34 points to lead Central Missouri to a 75-62 victory over Pittsburg State Saturday afternoon (Jan. 30).

The Gorillas (10-10, 8-5 MIAA), who dropped their fourth straight MIAA road decision, trailed just 61-58 with 6:56 to play in the game, but the Jennies (11-9, 7-6 MIAA) outscored Pitt State 14-4 down the stretch.

Pitt State got a team-leading 18 points from DePrice Taylor, who exited the game with a left ankle injury with 10:03 to play. Nicole McCombs scored seven second-half points, after being held scoreless in the first half, but McCombs was charged with a flagrant foul and ejected from the game with 8:21 remaining.

Roberts finished with a game-high 19 points, while Hanson chipped in with 15 for the Jennies, hitting five 3-pointers. Kara Fleming and Meghan Waggoner added 10 apiece.

Pittsburg State senior forward Nicole McCombs was named the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Jan. 4.

McCombs averaged 17.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game in Pitt State's three post-Christmas games against Central Missouri, Northwest Missouri and Missouri Southern. The senior from Richmond, Va., has been a crucial part of Pitt State's 5-1 conference start.

In only 19 minutes against Central Missouri, McCombs scored 19 points, 11 in the second half and nine in the last 2:33 of the game. Against Northwest, she recorded a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, both season highs. McCombs finished the week with 12 points and four rebounds in the win over Missouri Southern.

For the season, McCombs is Pitt State's second-leading scorer, averaging 12.6 points per game. She is the team's leading rebounder, averaging 6.6 boards per game. McCombs is shooting .603 from the field and .750 from the free throw line.

The Gorillas received three first-place votes and 86 total points in balloting of the MIAA's 11 coaches. Pitt State earned one first place vote and 236 points in voting among 28 regional media representatives.

Emporia State University earned the preseason No. 1 ranking in both polls, while Washburn University was tabbed second in each poll.

Pitt State posted a breakthrough 20-9 record during the 2008-09 season, advancing to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament under second-year head coach Lane Lord. The Gorillas notched their first 20-win season in a decade and narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA-II National Tournament.

"I think expectations are very high in our third year," said Lord. "With the players we have returning, like Nicole McCombs and DePrice Taylor, I think people are recognizing that we have good quality depth. It is flattering to get three first-place votes from the coaches and have our colleagues recognize that we can compete and the top of the league."

McCombs returns for her senior season after earning first-team All-MIAA honors as a junior last year. She averaged a team-leading 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game last season.

"It is nice to see that Pitt State is gaining respect among the coaches and media in the MIAA," McCombs said. "We appreciate the recognition, but hope to exceed expectations."

PSU IN EXHIBITION GAMES

The Gorillas played three exhibition games against teams from the Big 12 Conference. The Gorillas went 0-3 in those games, but got good experience against tough competition.

Pitt State fell to Kansas, 86-56. Nicole McCombs led the Gorillas with 11 points, while Maya Onikute and Larissa Richards shared the rebounding lead with six a piece.

Against Nebraska, the Gorillas lost 68-54, but played much better basketball. PSU trailed the Huskers by only three points with 11 minutes left in the game. Drew Roberts led the team with 17 points, while Laura Glenn led with seven rebounds.

The Gorillas led Kansas State for most of the first half, before poor shooting and turnovers helped them to a 89-61 loss to the Wildcats. McCombs again led the team in scoring, this time with 12 points. Onikute was the leading rebounder with nine.

Over the three exhibition games, Roberts led the team with 12.3 ppg and hit eight threes. while shooting .412 from the floor. McCombs was the only other player averaging double figures with 11.7 ppg. Maya Onikute led the team with 5.7 rpg and 2.7 avg.

GORILLAS SIGN THREE

Pittsburg State University Women's Basketball Coach Lane Lord announced the signing of three student-athletes in the early signing period on Thursday (Nov. 19.). Sara Molz, Katy Cooper and Y'cedria Devers will play for the Gorillas beginning in the 2010-11 season.

Cooper is a 6-2 forward from Stella, Mo. She is a student at East Newton High School. She earned All-Big Eight Conference honors last season as she helped East Newton to a 17-11 record in 2009. Last season she averaged 14 points and 12 rebounds per game. She has been a four-year starter in both basketball and volleyball for the Patriots. Cooper is undecided on a major. She is the daughter of Sara Camerer and Steve Cooper.

"Katy is very athletic," Lord said. "She runs the floor

well and blocks shots. She is very good in transition on both offense and defense. She will add a lot of athleticism in the post position."

Y'cedria Devers is a 5-9 guard/forward from Bixby, Oklahoma. She attends Bixby High School. In 2009 she was a Tulsa World honorable mention all-area selection. As a junior she averaged eight points, just over six rebounds and four steals per game. She is the daughter of Y'vette Cornelius and Cedric Devers and plans to major in early childhood education at PSU.

"Y'cedria is a combo guard who likes to get to the basket," Lord said. "She is a tremendous athlete who will work well with our style of play."

Sara Molz is a 5-4 point guard from Kiowa, Kan. She attends South Barber High School. Last season she averaged 13 points, 4.3 rebounds and 5.3 assists for the Cheiftans. She helped her team to a third place finish in the state in 2008 and a sub-state runner-up finish in 2009. She has been named all-state three times. In addition to being a four-year starter in basketball, Molz has also been a four-year starter in volleyball and a two-year letterwinner in track. She is the daughter of Ron and Kristi Molz and plans to major in elementary education at Pittsburg State.

"Sara is also a combo guard who can shoot the three," Lord said. "She is a floor leader and sees the floor very well."

"We fulfilled some needs in this recruiting class," Lord said. "We have signed a guard, forward and center that will replace some of the positions that we will lose after this season. All three are very athletic and talented."
