OPENING TIP

Pitt State has just one game this week against rival Missouri Southern on Wednesday at 5:30 p.m. in Joplin, Mo. The game will help to determine who wins the women's basketball point for the Sonic Trophy Series.

Pitt State won the first meeting between the two teams this season. If Pitt State wins this game, it will win the point. If Missouri Southern wins, the regular season series will be tied, so the final MIAA conference standings will determine who wins the point.

SONIC TROPHY SERIES

The Missouri Southern and Pittsburg State Athletics Departments are proud to announce the formation of the Sonic Trophy Series. The Sonic Trophy Series is a cooperative effort between MSSU, PSU and Sonic to reward and honor the athletics department that performs the best throughout the course of the year.

One point will be awarded in each of the thirteen sports in which both departments compete. The school with the most points at the end of the year will be presented the Sonic Trophy Series trophy.

The series is so far tied at 2-2. Pitt State won both the football and volleyball points, while Missouri Southern took both the men's and women's cross country points.

SCOUTING MISSOURI SOUTHERN

Missouri Southern is 12-9 on the season and 6-8 in MIAA play. Most recently the Lions won an 87-64 decision over Missouri Western in Joplin. The team is 4-4 in their last eight games, having won every other game.

The team averages 65.5 points and 40.6 rebounds per game. They are shooting .409 from the floor, including .300 from beyond the arc.

Jasmine Lovejoy leads the team with 14.8 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in steals with 31. Jolea Apon, the current MIAA Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week, is the Lions' second-leading scorer with 11.9 points per game. She leads the team with 65 threes on the season, an average of 3.1 per game. Against Missouri Western, she hit 11 threes to tie the MIAA record for threes in a game and set a new Missouri Southern record. Apon also leads the team in assists.

Michelle Hedgecock is second on the team in rebounds with 6.9 per game. Erin Rice leads the team in blocks with 11 on the season.

SCOUTING PITT STATE

The Gorillas are 11-11 on the season and 9-6 in MIAA play. They are currently third in the MIAA race. 10 of the 11 Pitt State losses have come on the road. The Gorillas did not suffer their first home loss until last week against Southwest Baptist.

Pitt State is shooting .386 from the floor and averaging 69.4 points and 42.0 rebounds per game. The team is hitting only .278 from three-point range and .675 from the charity stripe. One troubling spot for the Gorillas is the assist/turnover ratio. The Gorillas have only one assist for every 1.7 turnovers and average 19.8 turnovers a game.

DePrice Taylor leads the Gorillas with 14.0 points per game and is the third leading rebounder, grabbing 5.5 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in assists and steals. Nicole McCombs averages

13.3 points per game overall. She is the Gorillas' leading rebounder with 6.9 rpg. Bailey Waugh and Drew Roberts battle for Pitt State's three-point shooting lead. Roberts has 33 threes to 30 for Waugh. Waugh shooting a slightly better percentage, .326, from three-point range. Laura Glenn and Maya Onikute each grab over five rebounds a game for the Gorillas, Glenn with 5.4 and Onikute with 5.9. Amanda Orloske got her first start of her career against Missouri Western, played 35 minutes and scored in double figures for the first time in her career. She is averaging only 4.1 points per game overall, but has scored an average of just under double figures in each of the last six games.

As a team, the Gorillas give up 70.6 points per game, but out-rebound opponents by just over three rebounds per game.

PSU VS. MISSOURI SOUTHERN

Pitt State leads the series 38-27. Each team leads at its home venue, with Pitt State leading 23-15 in Pittsburg and Missouri Southern leading 21-15 in Joplin. MSSU holds the advantage at neutral sites, 1-0. The Lions have won six of the last eight meetings between the two teams.

The two teams split the series last season, with Pitt State earning a nine-point win in Joplin and MSSU taking a 58-55 victory from Pittsburg. Pitt State won the earlier meeting this season by one point.

Missouri Southern opened the series, which began on Dec. 13, 1974, with an eight game win streak. PSU did not earn its first win in the series until a one-point victory on Dec. 6, 1978 in Pittsburg.

The Gorillas did earn the longest win streak in the series, winning 10 straight from Jan. 28, 1998 to Feb. 13, 2002. The streak ended when Missouri Southern earned a 69-65 win over Pitt State in the MIAA Tournament on Feb. 25, 2002.

The largest margin of victory by either team in the series was a 87-44 (43 points) win by Missouri Southern on Feb. 15, 2006. Pitt State's biggest win was a 35-point (80-45) win on Feb. 16, 2000.

LAST TIME VS. MISSOURI SOUTHERN

The Pittsburg State women's basketball team (7-6, 5-1 MIAA) stretched its home winning streak to five games with a 67-66 win over rival Missouri Southern (8-4, 2-3 MIAA) on Saturday (Jan. 2) at John Lance Arena. Pitt State has won each of its last four Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association games.

The game was decided in the final two minutes. With Pitt State up by five, 65-60, and 2:11 on the clock, Missouri Southern's Michelle Hedgecock hit a layup, cutting the Gorilla lead to three. Pitt State's Nicole McCombs threw up a layup on the other end which was rebounded by the Lions. Danielle Harris shot and missed a three form Southern, but Jasmine Lovejoy was able to grab the offensive rebound and Kelby Fritz was fouled on the ensuing shot attempt. Despite shaky free throw shooting from the Lions through the game, Fritz hit both charity shots, bringing the game within one with 1:17 to go.

The Gorillas headed down to their end of the court, but a turnover by Maya Onikute gave the Lions the ball back and a chance for the lead with just over a minute left. Lovejoy missed the layup on the fast break and McCombs powered in the lane for the rebound for Pitt State. The Gorillas used up nearly 30 seconds on the clock before DePrice Taylor hit a jumper from the top corner of the lane to give the Gorillas a 67-64 advantage.

After a full time out by the Lions, Hedgecock drove the lane for a layup, again cutting the PSU lead to one with nine seconds left on the clock. Following a 30 second Pitt State timeout, MSSU went for a quick foul, fouling Laura Glenn just past half court and sending her to the line for a one-and-one attempt. Glenn uncharacteristically missed the free throw, but muscled to grab her own rebound and held on for the 67-66 Gorilla win.

Taylor led three Gorillas in double figures with 17 points. Glenn added 13, while McCombs scored 12. Glenn led the team on the glass with six rebounds. As a team Pitt State hit over 85 percent from the free throw line for the

second game in a row, going 19-for-22 on the night. Taylor was a perfect 5-for-5, while McCombs and Larissa Richards were each 4-for-4. The Gorillas struggled from three-point range, hitting only two of 13, with both long-range shots made by Bailey Waugh late in the second half.

Missouri Southern out-rebounded the Gorillas 39-34. Lions also shot better, 43 percent overall and 33 percent from three-point range to 40 percent overall and 15 percent from beyond the arc for the Gorillas. The Lions were led by Jasmine Lovejoy with 15 points. Erin, Rice, Jolea Apon and LaTice Jones each added 10 for MSSU. Rice and Danielle Harris each grabbed six rebounds.

Missouri Southern led most of the first half, but the Gorillas were able to keep the game close, never allowing the Lions more than a four-point lead. Pitt State grabbed the lead for good, 40-39, on a layup by McCombs with 15:31 to go in the game. The Gorillas expanded their lead to 11, first on a three by Bailey Waugh with 10:49 to go, then on layups by Whitney Conerly and Courtney Tate, with the last coming at the 8:22 mark. A 7-0 run by the Lions, cut the Pitt State lead to four, 60-56, with 5:15 remaining, leading up to the nailbiting last minutes of the game.

UP NEXT

After a weekend of rest, the Gorillas will face No. 10 Emporia State on Feb. 17 at 5:30 p.m. in John Lance Arena.

LAST TIME OUT

Two school records were set as the Pitt State women's basketball team (11-11, 9-6 MIAA) earned a 106-102 overtime win over Northwest Missouri (11-11, 7-8 MIAA) on Saturday afternoon in Pittsburg.

The 208 combined points in the game are the most combined points in school history. The previous high was 206 points in a 104-102 Pitt State win over Truman in Kirksville, Mo. on Jan. 28, 1995. The Gorillas also set a school record for most rebounds in a game as they grabbed 71 rebounds, including 34 off the offensive glass. The previous high was 64 rebounds against Missouri-St. Louis on Jan.

Two players recorded double-doubles for Pitt State. Nicole McCombs scored a season-high 25 points and pulled down 13 rebounds, including 11 off the offensive glass. Laura Glenn scored 12 points and grabbed 11 rebounds. Ten of Glenn's 12 points came on 10-of-11 shooting from the charity stripe. DePrice Taylor tied her career high with 24 points. Larissa Richards set a new career high with 19 points before an injury took her out of the game with 10:06 left in the game.

Northwest Missouri had five players score in double figures. Abby Henry led all players with 33 points. she was a perfect 12-for-12 from the charity stripe in a game that saw 57 total fouls committed. Gentry Dietz earned a double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Shelly Martin added 16. Gabby Curtis and Emily hauder scored 11 and 10, respectively.

Though Northwest shot slightly better than the Gorillas for the game, Pitt State made 10 more free throws and outrebounded the Bearcats 71-55. Pitt State also took care of the ball well in the last 40 minutes of the game. The Gorillas turned the ball over 10 times in the first 10 minutes of the game, but only committed 11 in the rest of the game.

Pitt State showed a lot of fortitude in the waning minutes of regulation to give themselves a chance for the win. The Gorillas trailed by eight with 5:57 to go in the game. In forty seconds, four points from Taylor whittled that lead to four. Two Abby Henry free throws gave the Bearcats a 6-point lead again, 80-74. Maya Onikute, who had only one point previously in the game, knocked down a three with 4:49 left to cut the Bearcat lead to three. The Gorillas continued to battle, holding Northwest within four until a second Onikute three put Pitt State within one with 1:50 remaining in regulation. Dietz drove in for a layup on the other end, giving Northwest a 87-84 advantage with a minute and a half to go. With 45 seconds left, Glenn drove hit a layup and was fouled. She nailed the free throw to tie the game 87-87. Each team had another shot to go ahead, with Pitt State getting the last attempt, but neither was successful, sending the game into overtime.

The two teams traded baskets through the first overtime. Pitt State scored first on a Taylor layup. Gabby Curtis answered with a three for Northwest. Pitt State gained a two-point advantage, 94-92 with 29 seconds left as Glenn hit the second of two free throws. Henry shot a layup on the other end to tie the game, and PSU missed a shot at the buzzer to head into the second overtime.

The second overtime belonged to the Gorillas. Taylor hit a layup five seconds in, and although the Bearcats tied the game three times, they were never able to take the lead. A Courtney Tate layup with 51 seconds remaining gave Pitt State a 104-100 advantage, their biggest lead of the game. The game's best free throw shooters, Henry for Northwest and Glenn for Pitt State, each made two more free throws to arrive at the final 106-102 score.

Northwest Missouri dominated the first half, holding as much as an 11-point lead, 40-29, with 2:13 to go. Pitt State went on a 10-2 run to end the first half down only three, 42-39.

HOME SWEET HOME

Seven of Pitt State's nine wins have come at home, while all of its losses have been on the road. Though good nights at Southwest Baptist and Northwest Missouri, have improved road stats, the confines of John Lance Arena have been a safer place for the Gorillas to play this season. MCCOMBS NAMED MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Pittsburg State senior forward Nicole McCombs was named the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Jan. 4.

McCombs averaged 17.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game in Pitt State's three post-Christmas games against Central Missouri, Northwest Missouri and Missouri Southern. The senior from Richmond, Va., has been a crucial part of Pitt State's 5-1 conference start.

In only 19 minutes against Central Missouri, McCombs scored 19 points, 11 in the second half and nine in the last 2:33 of the game. Against Northwest, she recorded a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, both season highs. McCombs finished the week with 12 points and four rebounds in the win over Missouri Southern.

For the season, McCombs is Pitt State's second-leading scorer, averaging 12.6 points per game. She is the team's leading rebounder, averaging 6.6 boards per game. McCombs is shooting .603 from the field and .750 from the free throw line.

McCombs is the daughter of Michael and Fronnie McCombs. She is majoring in psychology.

PRESEASON POLL

The Pittsburg State University women's basketball team drew the No. 3 pick by both conference coaches and media representatives in the 2009-10 MIAA Preseason Polls, released Tuesday (Oct. 27) at the Downtown Marriott.

The Gorillas received three first-place votes and 86 total points in balloting of the MIAA's 11 coaches. Pitt State earned one first place vote and 236 points in voting among 28 regional media representatives.

Emporia State University earned the preseason No. 1 ranking in both polls, while Washburn University was tabbed second in each poll.

Pitt State posted a breakthrough 20-9 record during the 2008-09 season, advancing to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament under second-year head coach Lane Lord. The Gorillas notched their first 20-win season in a decade and narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA-II National Tournament.

"I think expectations are very high in our third year," said Lord. "With the players we have returning, like Nicole McCombs and DePrice Taylor, I think people are recognizing that we have good quality depth. It is flattering to get three first-place votes from the coaches and have our colleagues recognize that we can compete and the top of the league."

McCombs returns for her senior season after earning first-team All-MIAA honors as a junior last year. She averaged a team-leading 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game last season.

"It is nice to see that Pitt State is gaining respect among the coaches and media in the MIAA," McCombs said. "We appreciate the recognition, but hope to exceed expectations."

Against Nebraska, the Gorillas lost 68-54, but played much better basketball. PSU trailed the Huskers by only three points with 11 minutes left in the game. Drew Roberts led the team with 17 points, while Laura Glenn led with seven rebounds.

The Gorillas led Kansas State for most of the first half, before poor shooting and turnovers helped them to a 89-61 loss to the Wildcats. McCombs again led the team in scoring, this time with 12 points. Onikute was the leading rebounder with nine.

Over the three exhibition games, Roberts led the team with 12.3 ppg and hit eight threes. while shooting .412 from the floor. McCombs was the only other player averaging double figures with 11.7 ppg. Maya Onikute led the team with 5.7 rpg and 2.7 apg.

GORILLAS SIGN THREE

Pittsburg State University Women's Basketball Coach Lane Lord announced the signing of three student-athletes in the early signing period on Thursday (Nov. 19.). Sara Molz, Katy Cooper and Y'cedria Devers will play for the Gorillas beginning in the 2010-11 season.

Cooper is a 6-2 forward from Stella, Mo. She is a student at East Newton High School. She earned All-Big Eight Conference honors last season as she helped East Newton to a 17-11 record in 2009. Last season she averaged 14 points

and 12 rebounds per game. She has been a four-year starter in both basketball and volleyball for the Patriots. Cooper is undecided on a major. She is the daughter of Sara Camerer and Steve Cooper.

"Katy is very athletic," Lord said. "She runs the floor well and blocks shots. She is very good in transition on both offense and defense. She will add a lot of athleticism in the post position."

She helped her team to a third place finish in the state in 2008 and a sub-state runner-up finish in 2009. She has been named all-state three times. In addition to being a four-year starter in basketball, Molz has also been a four-year starter in volleyball and a two-year letterwinner in track. She is the daughter of Ron and Kristi Molz and plans to major in elementary education at Pittsburg State.

"Sara is also a combo guard who can shoot the three," Lord said. "She is a floor leader and sees the floor very well."
